

As we mention in the last newsletter, this year we are offering something a little different and we hope you like it. We have two parts to the reunion. The first part is the normal reunion at the hotel, hospitality room, trips, etc. and the second part is a 7-day cruise to Bermuda which will actually be the week prior to the regular reunion. We hope that you will make both parts but if you can only do one part, we are requesting you do the regular reunion at the hotel.

Part 1—Regular Hotel, Trips, Hospitality Room, etc.

The planning is complete and the reunion promises to be a great event. We will be staying at the Hilton Garden Inn City Center in Philadelphia. It has a great location within walking distance of many activities, museums, restaurants & theaters and will act as the hub for all of our planned activities. May in Philly is a very busy time so we really do need each of you to book your hotel reservation as soon as possible if you haven't already. We only have a few rooms left in our reservation block. 
